Dear colleagues,

since 2017, the BMBF-funded **NAVICARE network for patient-oriented health services research** has been working towards the goal of reducing barriers and inequalities in the care of patients with age-associated diseases.

Alongside developing structures in health services research, interventions to improve care coordination were developed in two research projects CoreNAVI and COMPASS. Feasibility studies were conducted to evaluate these interventions. Our investigations focused on the utilization of patient navigators to support stroke and lung cancer patients in organizing care, as well as coordinated collaboration between primary care physicians and community care points (Pflegestützpunkte) to aid in the care of elderly and multimorbid patients.

As the end of the project is approaching, we would like to take this opportunity to present our findings from the NAVICARE studies. We aim to contextualize these results within the current international state of research and the German health care environment. Additionally, we want to discuss with international and regional experts from research and health care. We like to focus on how to effectively measure the impacts of navigation interventions and which new health care professions with focus on care organization can improve the care of individuals with chronic diseases – as well as their potential limitations.

We are looking forward to discussing with you and welcoming you to our upcoming symposium!

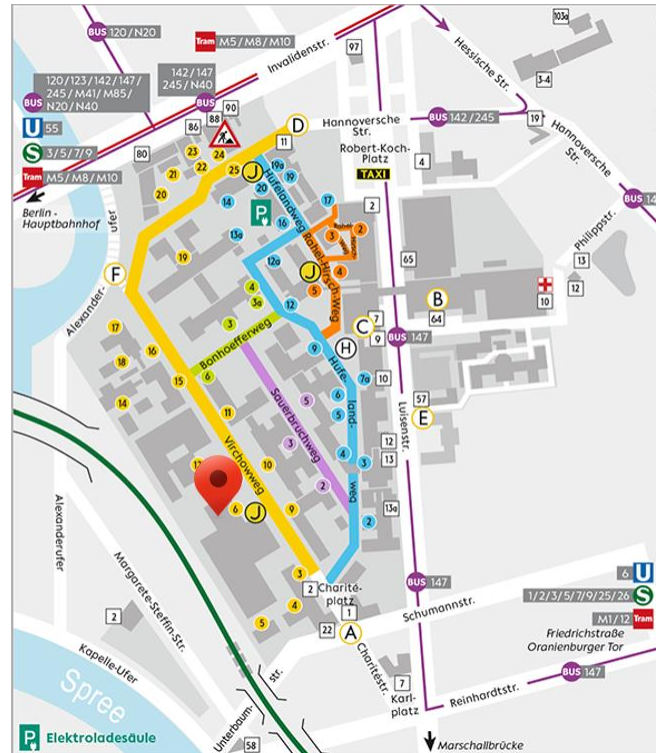
